La Bohème Cabins

General Cabins

There are five accommodation areas: Forepeak, two fore cabins, saloon and skipper's aft cabin.

The accommodation is typically Scandinavian, with open berths rather than small cabins.

In the forepeak, or crew quarters, there are four sailor's bunks, two either side, with generous space around (Images 1 & 2).

Next, there are two open cabins, one with two bunks and one with three bunks, the third sized for a younger person (Images 3 & 4)).

In the saloon, there are six mid-level bunks, three in line each side, and each with large stowage space beneath (Image 5).

The skipper's aft cabin has two bunks with a settee in the middle and skylight (Images 7 - 9).

- 2. Forepeak bunks, before painting, showing typical mattresses. Stowage under seating and at end of bunks.







3. Starboard fore cabin, with three bunks, and storage of deep drawers and hanging area behind curtain
